**Medina County Health Department Lodi Clinic for Physicals Closes
Immunizations and WIC Services Continue in Lodi**

Lodi, OH – The Medina County Health Department clinic providing physicals for children and teens at the Lodi Resource Center closed on August 2, 2010. Physicals for children and teens are available at the Medina County Health Department by appointment. Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) services and an immunization clinic will continue to be available on the third Wednesday of the month at the Lodi Resource Center. For over 27 years, the Medina County Health Department has provided childhood immunizations in Lodi, Ohio.

The Lodi Resource Center is located at 119 Bank Street in Lodi. Immunizations services are available in Lodi on the third Wednesday of the month from 9:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. For an immunization appointment, contact the Public Health Nursing Division at 330-723-9688 or toll-free at 1-888-723-9688. No child will be denied immunizations due to inability to pay. The Medina County Health Department accepts Medicaid, Care Source, Well Care, and Buckeye Community. The administration fee per vaccine for Medina County residents without Medicaid is \$10, and the cost for non-residents of Medina County without Medicaid is \$15.

In addition to the immunization clinic, WIC is available by appointment. WIC provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support and education, and vouchers for nutritious foods. Appointments are required. For a WIC appointment, please call 330-723-9629 or toll-free at 1-888-723-9688.
